	The meeting was attended by the Countryside Access Team Leader to discuss the Councillors concerns regarding footpath and bridleway changes on Llanmadoc Hill, Hardings Down and Ryers Down. These changes are being carried out to adopt different routes for legal records. The bridleways will become part of cycle/bridleway routes through Gower, there are 40 miles of routes in total and this plan attempts to join them up and advertise and promote them as such. The Councillors looked at the maps provided and questioned need for some changes, stressing they would be unhappy with off road cycling being actively encouraged.	
	<ul> <li>The issue was discussed in detail and the Councillors came to the following decisions:</li> <li>Llanmadoc Hill - no objection to changes in principle.</li> <li>Harding's Down - no objection to changes in principle.</li> <li>Ryers Down - the Councillors are not happy with extinction of the footpath, it was agreed that this should remain. Also they cannot understand why the bridleway needs to be moved up onto the hill. They voted 8-1 to leave both the footpath and bridleway at Ryers Down as they are at present.</li> </ul>	
	The Councillors are also very concerned about the proposed promotion of the bridleways as off road cycle routes, they understand that the information is already public, if anyone looks for it, but they do not want the area highlighted and promoted for off road cycling as this may cause problems with traffic, litter, cycle events occurring etc. Also they are concerned about the damage to the environment and bio-diversity of the area. The Councillors do not want these routes to be advertised and promoted. Jayne to feedback the information.	JE
