Water Testing

Further to the request that the water in the well in Llangennith be tested, the Council has now received a reply from C&C Swansea which stated that springs/wells used for human consumption are classed as private water supplies. In this situation the local authority is responsible for assessing and sampling certain private water supplies. They have to charge and someone has to act as the controller of the supply. The well may be better classed as a natural watercourse rather than a drinking supply, which would only be monitored if there was a pollution incident. In this situation, C&C Swansea do not feel it would be worthwhile taking a spot sample as a natural watercourse will usually show the presence of bacteria and the water quality will fluctuate with the weather conditions.

Coast Path at Cwm Ivy

C&C Swansea continue to try to resolve the issue of the coast path. They are currently consulting on a scheme for a suspension bridge. The span of the bridge would be 30m metres, which would allow for a further expansion of the breach in the seawall. It is recognised that such a large structure would have an impact on the local landscape. However, they suggest it is a graceful design and would form an attraction in itself, enabling the public to better appreciate the salt marsh. It would be no more visually intrusive than other structures which have recently been constructed nearby.
