The six defibrillators around the areas have needed some maintenance, three were in need of new pads and one in need of a new battery, these have been purchased by the Community Council and are now fully up and running. The defibrillator in Cwm Ivy has a low battery, this machine is covered a service contract and a replacement battery has been ordered and will be replaced shortly.

The annual common land inspection, of land owned by the Community Council, will be taking place on Friday October 30th 2020. Due to Covid-19 restrictions this will be carried out by only 3 Councillors who will report their findings back to the Council. This inspection looks at any maintenance needed to land, trees and seating, any safety issues and ideas for improvements.

During the summer, there has been a noticeable increase in traffic all over Gower and there have been reports of speeding through the three main villages (Bury Green, Llanmadoc and Llangennith). The Community Council are aware of the situation and although are unable to do anything about it themselves they are willing to support the villagers in petitioning City & County of Swansea and the local police to ask for traffic calming measures and signage.

The Community Council were asked if they could fund the public liability insurance for the Beach Clean-up Team that voluntarily clean the beaches every Tuesday, there can sometimes be up to 80 volunteers, mainly local people, carrying out this activity and they clean the beaches of Whitford, Broughton, Blue Pool and Llangennith. The Councillors voted unanimously to fund this at the cost of £73.65p.

The landslide at Cheriton - there has been no news regarding this, but since holding the last Community Council meeting, it appears that some work has commenced on this.

If anyone is interested there are still a few bird boxes available to place in gardens, as part of the bio-diversity project. If you have a suitable tree please let the clerk know via e-mail.
