The Community Council have some small nest boxes that need placing in trees around the areas in the autumn, in readiness for the birds to use for nesting next spring, if anyone has any ideas of where these can be placed, please contact us. This is part of the bio-diversity project the Council has committed to, if anyone would like to be involved with this project or has any ideas for their community, please contact myself or any of the Community Councillors to express your interest or put forward your suggestions.

We have bought a new seat to replace the broken seat on Burry Green (behind the bus stop), this will be in place shortly. The seat is made from recycled plastic, it makes it long lasting and durable, knot and splinter free, maintenance free, water and rot resistant and ecologically friendly. It should not need replacing for many years.

Further monetary assistance has been given to this Parish magazine due to their increased cost throughout this difficult period, it is hoped this will help to keep the magazine in print as the Community Council feel it is an essential resource for the whole community.

We have arranged for the area of land behind Llanmadoc Village Hall, which is owned by the Community Council, to be cut back to form a fire break as this has become rather overgrown.

Local Places for Nature (a Keep Wales Tidy Project), it has not been possible to find an area for a Community Fruit Garden as it requires a large plot of land, so the Community Council have requested that this be swapped for a Community Wildlife or Butterfly Garden which requires less ground. They are investigating areas they could place this on that can be accessed by the community and will give further details in the future.

The roads, footpaths and bridleways around Gower are very busy at this time of year. Should anyone notice any problems with highways or footpaths/bridleways, please let me know via e-mail or a phone call, providing me with the exact location. I report issues regularly, but I am not always aware of problems. Outstanding and ongoing works can be found on the meeting minutes.
